THE TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST NOVEMBER 13, 2011

IN the Final Judgment, “the day of Christ Jesus,” He will show each person how he has valued and used the hours that hurry like tumbling water through careless fingers. The eternal value of passing opportunities is clearly taught in the feasts of Christ the King, of All Saints and of All Souls, and in the final Sundays of the Liturgical Year. The lesson is that, in the end, each person will be judged by his sincere love of God and man. A Christian’s discerning love must include obedience to, and support of, both Church authority and civil authority.
